Public Mass: Members of the parish pastoral council met this week to examine the Framework document and we hope to be in a position to re-open the three churches in the parish for public worship from tomorrow week, Monday 29th June. Specific details on how the Framework document will be implemented in our three churches will be finalised this week and details will be published in next week's newsletter. The churches must re-open in a safe way. Numbers will be limited due to the 2-metre social distancing rule that is currently in place. The dispensation from Sunday and Holy Day obligation is extended for the time being. It goes without saying that those who feel unwell or have any of the Covid-19 symptoms or have been in recent contact with someone with Covid-19 should not attend Mass. The weekend Masses in Corlough, Kilnavart and Bawnboy will be streamed live on the parish facebook page from the first weekend in July for those who cannot attend. Mid-week anniversary Masses or Funeral Masses can also be streamed by request.

Funerals: The Government announced that 25 people can attend funerals now provided that the proper physical distancing rules are adhered to at all times.

Mass Intentions: If you have a weekend or weekday Mass booked for a deceased family member in the near future, or if a recent one was cancelled, you may wish to contact Fr Sean. People can book a Mass for their loved ones and participate in it by tuning into FM108 or by watching it on the internet. If you wish to attend the Mass, it might be best to wait until the restrictions have been lifted before you re-book your intention. If you have an intention booked for the 11am Mass in Bawnboy in the coming weeks, I will take it that you are happy for me to fulfil your intention if I don't hear from you.

Kilmore Diocesan 'Virtual' Pilgrimage to Knock will take place this afternoon. Pilgrims are welcome to join the afternoon ceremonies from their homes. The schedule for the afternoon will include the praying of the Rosary at 2.30pm, followed by Mass and Benediction at 3pm. Pilgrims may place their petitions online on the Knock Shrine website and these will be placed on the altar for the Mass. Many pilgrims light candles for loved ones and their intentions during their visit to Knock Shrine and this service is also available online. A candle will be lit at the outdoor candelabra for each request received. The pilgrimage will be streamed live on www.knockshrine.ie and Radio Maria (Saorview TV Channel 210) will also broadcast the pilgrimage.
