Level 5 - Living with Covid-19

Religious services move online. Places of worship remain open for private prayer. Up to 25 people can attend a funeral or a wedding. People can go beyond the 5km travel limit to visit a grave or to attend a funeral or a wedding.

Mass intentions: If you have a Mass intention booked in the coming weeks and would rather wait until the restrictions have been lifted, please contact Fr Sean. The Mass intentions booked for Kilnavart and Bawnboy on the coming Sunday mornings will be offered at the 11am Mass.

November Service: Today, at 3pm, special ceremonies will take place throughout the country to dedicate the month of November to Remembrance of the Dead and Prayer for the Bereaved. This service will be broadcast from our parish on FM108 and streamed live on the Parish Facebook page. We will remember by name the 17 people from our parish who sadly died since last November and candles will be lit in remembrance of them. Prayers will also be offered for those who died by Covid-19.

Remembrance Tree: Thank you to the Pope John Paul II Award candidates for putting up the trees in our three churches. As a precaution in these Covid times, people are asked to bring their own pens to write the names of their loved ones on the tags provided.

All Souls' Day: Traditionally, three Masses are said on this day. One of them is offered for the pope's intentions and one for the faithful departed.

November Altar Lists of the Dead: are available at the back of each church and in the your Envelope boxes. Please put your list in the envelope provided in your box of envelopes and return as soon as possible. 12 Masses will be celebrated in the parish throughout the month of November for the people on the November Lists.

First Friday Visitation: will not take place this week due to the Level-5 restrictions. Fr Sean will phone each person on the First Friday list in the coming days instead.

November Indulgences for 2020 The Office of the Apostolic Penitentiary in Rome has announced modifications to the Plenary Indulgence for the deceased during the month of November. Due to the coronavirus pandemic and the need to avoid large groups from forming where prohibited, the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of 1 to 8 November. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on any day in November, and devoutly prays for the faithful departed. Regarding the Plenary Indulgence attached to All Souls' Day, 2 November, this year, it can be obtained not only on the preceding or succeeding Sunday, or on the actual Feast day, but on any other day of the month chosen by each member of the faithful. In this case, the indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed, and the other requirements associated with a Plenary Indulgence. For anyone who cannot leave their home for various reasons, including anti-Covid restrictions, they too can obtain the Plenary Indulgence by "uniting themselves spiritually to other members of the faithful". In this case, the condition of being "completely detached from sin" and the intention of completing the other requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence remain. These conditions are Sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions. The Decree suggests that such prayer take place before an "image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary". Among the various prayers that are recommended are "prayers for the deceased, Morning or Evening Prayer from the Office of the Dead, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, meditating on various Gospel passages proposed for the liturgy of the Dead, or completing a work of mercy by offering to God the suffering and discomforts of one's own life".
